Objections and statements according Section 73 para. 4 VwVfG in conjunction with Section

21 para. 2 and 5 UVPG

Any person whose interests are affected by the project may, up to **one month** after the end of the inspection period (receipt at the Agency by the **21 July 2023)**, lodge objections to the plan in writing or otherwise put on record at the Federal Maritime and Hydrographic Agency in Hamburg or Rostock (Section 73 para. 4 sentence 1 Administrative Procedure Act (VwVfG) in conjunction with Section 21 para. 2 and 5 UVPG). The objections have to include name and address, the legally protected interest and the supposed encroachment. Following the closing date for lodging objections, for the planning approval procedure no objections shall be allowed except those which rest on specific titles enforceable under private law (Section 73 para. 4 sentence 3 VwVfG; Section 7 para. 4 in conjunction with Section 1 para. 1 N° 1a and Section 7 para. 6 Environmental Remedies Act (UmwRG)).

Recognised Associations

Associations which, on the basis of recognition under other legislation, are empowered to appeal against the planning approval decision under the Code of Administrative Court Procedure may submit statements to the plan within the aforementioned period. Following the closing date for the aforementioned period, these statements for the planning approval procedure are also excluded (Section 73 para. 4 sentence 3, 5 and 6 VwVfG; Section 7 para. 4 in conjunction with Section 1 para. 1 N° 1a and Section 7 para. 6 Environmental Remedies Act (UmwRG)).

Comments on environmental impact according Section 21 para. 1 UVPG

The public concerned may comment in writing or put on record on the environmental impact of the project in the context of the participation (Section 21 para. 1 UVPG). The comment period closes **one month** after the end of the public display (Section 21 para. 2 UVPG). Following the closing date for submitting comments, no comments shall be allowed for this planning approval procedure on the admissibility of the project except those, which rest on specific titles enforceable under private law (Section 21 para. 4 UVPG).
