The legislation is **not** always **specific** on the focus and responsible institution for **providing guidance**

National institutions with legal obligations for provision of guidance to LGs?



Albania: National Environmental Agency and the line ministries-on local AQ plans

B&H: Ministry of Environment and Tourism of the Federation of BH and the Ministry of Spatial Planning, Civil Engineering and Ecology of the RS-guidance and supervisory guidance

Kosovo: Ministry of Environment, Spatial Planning and Infrastructure-on local AQ plans

Montenegro: Ministry for Ecology, Spatial Planning and Urbanism

North Macedonia: no clear responsibilities, apart from inspection and monitoring, and cooperation in preparing planning documents

Serbia: Ministry of Environmental Protection and Serbian Environmental Protection Agency-coordination



Obligations performed in practice

LGs with limited capacities on AQ issues: scarce finances, lack of human resources and sector expertise Hinders systematic approach in protecting AQ Guidance from national institutions of crucial mportance for LGs to fulfill their legal obligations

The guidance can be effective only if it is **timely**, **systematic**, **regular**



What can be improved?

Ways that LGs can further support national level institutions

Ways that national level institutions can further support LGs

Ensure that LGs have enough resources to fulfil their legal obligations

Increase coordination and support between national level institutions and LGs

Store data in easy to access and well-maintained databases

Educate LG staff on AQ

Improved communication and collaboration with LGs

Guidance on air quality monitoring

Increase human and institutional capacities for AQM

Share collected data with national institutions and the public

Develop local AQ strategies and participate in developing national and regional strategies

Raise local awareness on AQ

Increase public participation in AQ improvement measures

What can be improved?
